Since 1991, the Ager association has been working to promote research into the rural archaeology and history of Roman Gaul, by organising a biennial thematic conference in even-numbered years.

From 2025 onwards, the association would like to hold a topical day on odd-numbered years to strengthen the links between the community of researchers working on this theme. This new meeting format will provide an opportunity to present research works on the themes covered by the association. Presentations of recent discoveries, synthesis works, methodological approaches or interdisciplinary research projects will be appreciated. Recently defended academic works will also be highlighted.

**Proposals for paper and posters**

Papers and posters (A0 or A1) may be presented in French or English (posters will not be presented orally).

Each proposal must include (see form) :

- A title (in French and English);
- Author's contact details, including affiliations and full contact details;
- 5 key words (in French and English);
- An abstract of no more than 2,500 characters for papers and no more than 1,500 characters for posters (in French or English).

Proposals must be submitted to [ager.actualites@gmail.com](mailto:ager.actualites@gmail.com) by 5 September 2025. The document must be submitted in .doc or .odt format, with the prefix POS\_ (for posters) or COM\_ (for papers) preceding the author's name.

Speaking time is set at a maximum of 15 minutes, followed by 5 minutes for discussion.

## Publication of the day

With a view to publication, authors are committed to submit a text (approximately 15,000 characters for papers and 7,500 characters for posters) and illustrations, the standards for which will be sent as soon as the proposal has been accepted.
